

Entry Terms & CONDITIONS

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE NOMINATING FOR THE EVENT

- One horse/rider combination only is permitted per rider for all show classes, ASHLA, challenge, dressage, showjumping and sporting events.
- Under 8 competitors must be unassisted.
- Two horses are permitted per rider in the campdraft. The second horse cannot be entered in the same age group.
- A horse cannot be competed in different age groups, with the exception of the Under 8 ring and the campdraft.
- Challenge event consists of Hack, Working, Time Trial and Cattle Work.
- Challenge in the event of a tie, countback will start with the hack pattern until resolved.
- Cattle section of the challenge will be run as a cattle work section. Rules will be published prior to the show.
- Campdraft run under ABCRA rules.
- Riders must enter and compete in a minimum of 3 events to be eligible to compete in the campdraft.
- All cattle sections are subject to cattle availability.
- Cattle levy of \$20.00 is included in challenge and campdraft entry fees.
- AM7 rules apply for the show jumping.
- All events, with the exception of ASHLA and Youth Judging, are eligible for the Hi Point awards.
- Nomination platform Nominate (surcharge applies).
- No refunds will be given once nominations have closed.
- First Aid levy of \$15 per competitor will be applied to entries.
- Camping fee of \$20 per night will be applied to entries.
- Volunteer name must be submitted with all nominations.



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- All competitors must be a junior member or a junior participant member of the ASHS. Membership numbers must be provided with entries.
- Temporary memberships are not permitted.
- All horse must be ASH registered, including horses handled and ridden by competitors under 13 years of age.
- No colts or stallions to be on the ground during the event.
- Bits used must be within ASHS Rules and Regulations.
- The committee has the right to alter or defer the program or timing of events on the day, and classes may be moved into other rings at the discretion of the committee.
- Competitors under 21 years of age must wear an approved equestrian helmet, which must securely fasten under the chin when mounted anywhere within the perimeter of the grounds, including public areas, as well as in led and handler events.
- Dress Code for competition and presentations long sleeve shirt, tie, jodphurs or stockmans cut jeans with a coat or ASH jumper; exception of sporting events where polo and jodhpur/jeans are allowed.
- All people entering the grounds, competitors and handlers, do so at their own risk. Neither the organising committee nor the Australian Stock Horse Society Ltd accept any liability for any accidents, damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, spectators or any other person.
- All riders must present to first aid tent following a fall before being allowed to continue to compete.
- Electric fencing tape may be used in designated areas size restrictions will apply.



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- Any prizemoney will be paid into the nominated bank accounts within 21 days after the completion of the show.
- Images: Any photos/videos of competitors taken by authorised photographers/videographers associated with the Australian Stock Horse Society may be used by the Society for promotional or training purposes

- Protest: Any competitor or exhibitor may lodge a protest in writing to the secretary of the show committee within 30 minutes of the completion of an event. The protest must be accompanied by a fee of \$50 and is refundable if the protest is upheld. The protest shall be heard by the Disputes Committee and may be dealt with as the Disputes Committee may direct.
- Dispute committee consists of 3 nominated committee members.
- Drug testing may be carried out during the National Youth Show.
- Horse Substitutions prior to the event: Horse substitutions due to injury or death are permitted up to 24 hours prior to the commencement of the event.
- Horse Substitutions during the event: Horse substitutions due to injury or death are permitted at the discretion of the committee. Any points awarded after a horse substitution will not be eligible for the Hi Point awards.
- All horse substitutions are subject to verification of horse registration and owner membership and must be eligible to compete in the nominated event.



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- Dressage specific conditions:
 - All classes will be conducted under EA rules and regulations, unless ASHS take precedence (i.e. it is not essential to use a dressage saddle as ASHS rules and regulations take precedence). EA rules can be found at the following link

- Callers are permitted for all age groups.
- Gear checks must be completed prior to your test and is compulsory so please check the rules carefully prior to competition. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure their gear check is completed prior to their test.
- Current Australian Standard Association or international equivalent helmets must be worn during competition, these must be securely fastened under the chin.
- Presentations will take place at the end of competition day and will be mounted.
